Minutes

Approval of the Agenda

Fire Report

Fire Chief, Justin Korman-One First Responder call. Lynd Public School Grades K – 4th toured the fire hall earlier in October. Clerk stated Denton Gregg turned in his employee forms for the fire department. Dillon got two of the three hydrants that needed repair completed. Council needs to approve him to the fire department. Diane made a motion to approve Denton Gregg on the fire department, Don seconded and all voted in favor. David made a motion to approve the fire report, Jerry seconded and all voted in favor.

Law Enforcement Report

Public Works Report

Dillon reported: Dillon was absent provided written report

- 1. Sidewalk was completed from city office to S. River St. Mailbox will be left in the new location.

Tried several times to contact the people who live in the remaining mobile home to do the meter install have received no response back. - 3. Talked to Aaron VanMoer about the speed limit on County Road 30. Aaron stated city has to make an official request to the county to change the speed limit then county will contact MNDOT to request a speed survey of the road

City of Lynd 2022 Fees and Utility Rates Schedule – Diane made a motion to approve the schedule, Don seconded and all voted in favor.

Water and Sewer 2022 Budgets - Diane made a motion to approve the Water and Sewer 2022 Budgets, Jerry seconded and all voted in favor.

Council Committees - Roads/Streets and EDA Development. David will report on the roads at the next meeting.

Bids for items city selling – Diane turned in a bid of \$47 for the shelving, desk, entertainment center and crates. Jerry made a motion to accept Diane's bid, David seconded and all voted in favor.
